MPhil in Public Policy

The MPhil program aims to train students in conducting original research in public policy, and to cultivate independent, interdisciplinary and innovative thinking that is essential for a successful career in public policy research.

12 credits of coursework, including:

- 9 credits of Core Courses; and
- 3 credits of Elective Course

PhD in Public Policy

The PhD in Public Policy program provides rigorous training in public policy research to academically outstanding students aspiring to pursue a career in policy research and teaching.

21 credits of coursework, including:

- 9 credits of Core Courses; and
- 12 credits of Elective Courses

HKUST will provide various scholarship or studentship for the full-time research postgraduate students (MPhil/PhD).
